# MJ Students Read for the World Record

Research shows that children who read four or more books over the summer can avoid learning losses and perform better on reading comprehension tests in the fall. That's why Scholastic is working with Marion Jordan to make reading a fun summer activity with the Read for the World Record Challenge.

In conjunction with our May Book Fair, MJ students will be invited to join the team of kids from across the country attempting to set a summer reading world record.

The world record attempt begins May 1 and concludes August 31, 2009. Two world record categories will be recog-

nized in the 2010 edition of the Scholastic Book of World Records: Total minutes read by ALL participating students across the U.S.; and the top 20 schools with the most total minutes read.

Students will receive Read for the World Record instructions, plus a personal reading log at the May Book Fair. Here are a few simple ways to coach your child to become a record-breaking leader:

- Go over the booklist with your child and talk about books she/he might enjoy.
- Visit the Book Fair with your child and check out she/he

teacher's summer reading recommendations.

- Encourage reading throughout the summer with library visits, story time at home, and conversations about books. Let your child see YOU reading.

## Ways and Means Report

Thank you to everyone who purchased a magnet or other keepsake with your child's art on it. We thought the kids did a super job with the artwork, and we hope that you were pleased with the results as well. Our sincere thanks to our room parents as well for their help and hard work in obtaining such great work from the kids.

The Art to Remember sale raised about \$900, which brings our funds raised-to-date to around \$12,900, which is \$2,100 below expectations. Manna has raised around \$1,500 to-date, which is about \$3,500 short of our goal for that program. Combined, these shortfalls amount to approximately \$5,500.

### How Can We Close the Gap?

We have cut back our spending on a variety of programs this year...but have some remaining oppor-

tunities for our families to contribute to the MJPTA — by doing things they ordinarily would (getting ice cream, buying gift cards as presents, buying food or going out to dinner)...

We'll have a special event at Oberweis after tonight's Open House! Please stop in and get yourself and your family a tasty treat! A portion of the proceeds will benefit the Marion Jordan PTA.

With the end of this school year quickly approaching, we are hoping to make up a portion of our shortfall with some of our regular convenience fundraisers. Please keep Manna cards in mind as you plan for teacher gifts, graduation gifts, birthday gifts and any other occasion that could use a gift card. You can even use Manna cards for your regular shopping trips. We are hopeful we can repeat what has in the past been a very profit-

able time of year for Manna. We will be placing two Manna orders in May with deadlines of Friday, May 15<sup>th</sup>, and Friday, May 29<sup>th</sup>. Also, consider Market Day for delicious, quick and convenient meals during the busy days ahead or instead of buying like items at the grocery store.

In regards to other fundraising opportunities, be on the lookout for another dine-and-share. We are optimistic that a May dine-and-share would be more successful and the weather less problematic than with past events (though you never know, the dine-and-share gods could always send a May snowstorm my way — "Did I say that?").

## Recycle Old Computers, Medical Equipment

John G. Conyers Learning Academy's annual computer recycling event will be held from 9:30 a.m.-1 p.m., May 14-15, at the Conyers Learning Academy east parking lot, 2800 Central Road, Rolling Meadows.

Residents may assist by donating:

- Used computer equipment, including PCs (Pentium or higher), Apples (G3 or higher), or printers and monitors, etc.
- Used medical equip-

ment such as crutches or walkers, etc.

This is the sixth-annual CLA/Assistive Technology Exchange Network (ATEN) computer recycling event. Operated with staff and students from CLA's Anger Control, Character Education, Empathy Training, and Social Skills (ACES) and Multiple Needs (MN) programs, the annual event has yielded an estimated 65 tons of computer and medical equipment that has been recycled or refurbished to benefit children and adults with disabilities.

A program of United Cerebral Palsy of Greater Chicago, ATEN's mission is to increase computer and assistive technology access for students with disabilities throughout the state. # Spotlight on the Board

*Spotlight on the Board* is a synopsis of notes and recordings taken at the District 15 School Board meetings by Frank C. Whiteley PTA's school board liaison, Jennifer Mondy. They are meant to help parents and staff who are unable to attend the Board meetings on a regular basis to keep informed about the issues and plans affecting the district. These Notes are not endorsed by District 15 or the Board of Education. Below are the highlights from the April 15<sup>th</sup> Regular Board of Education Meeting.

## **Committee of the Whole (COW) Agenda Attachments (Website)**

A Board member requested that presentations and other information provided at the public COW meetings be available online for the community to review as is currently done for the district's Regular meetings. The Board agreed to make the request retroactive to include past presentations on full day kindergarten, middle schools and other topics.

## **Bid Award – Curtain Wall**

Upon further examination of the contract, the Board approved the base bid of \$1.3M to replace exterior walls that included existing windows at Lake Louise, Hunting Ridge and Winston Campus. An alternate proposal

to add additional operable windows for a cost of \$142,700 was questioned as to whether it was an appropriate use of the district's reserve funds and subsequently rejected. The administration will provide the rationale and a breakdown of costs of the remaining proposals to the new Board at the May 5<sup>th</sup> meeting.

## **New District 15 Board of Education**

Newly elected Board members Margaret "Peggy" Babcock, Mark Bloom and Richard Bokor will be seated at the May 5<sup>th</sup>. Regular meeting after recognition of outgoing members Nancy Lee Carlson, Kelly Keenan and Wendy Rowden.

## **May 27<sup>th</sup> Committee of the Whole Agenda**

Administrators plan to present their ideas and supporting research for 21<sup>st</sup> Century Teaching and Learning in the district and Summer Opportunities for students. This is the last of the Committee of the Whole meetings focusing on beginning conversations about expanding educational programs.

## **Last Day of School – Monday, June 8<sup>th</sup>**

Due to the district's use of three emergency days (snow/cold) this year, the official last day of

school for 1<sup>st</sup> through 7<sup>th</sup> grades is Monday, June 8<sup>th</sup> which will be a half day. The last day for kindergarten is Friday, June 5<sup>th</sup>.

## Note from Nutrition Services

Starting Monday, May 4th, elementary students will no longer be able to charge (use I.O.U.'s) lunch or a la carte items. If your student owes money for lunch or a la carte, he/she will not be able to purchase **anything** until the I.O.U. is paid. Your student must have sufficient funds in his/her account for any purchases after this date.

If your student has a balance at the end of the school year, this balance will be transferred to his/her account at the junior high he/she will be attending. student's account.

Cash refunds of less than \$10.00 can be issued to your student upon receipt of a signed parent/guardian note. Refunds greater than \$10.00 will be issued by a District check and mailed home to the address indicated once a parent request has been received. Please be advised that we cannot issue cash refunds the last three days of school.

Mealtime Online will be turned off from Thursday, June 4, 2009, until Monday, August 17, 2009. No online payments can be made between these dates.
